The impact of this session: The children were excited and engaged in this session. The children learnt new vocabulary of instrumental names and the different sounds that they make. The children practiced turn taking and applauding everyone's effort when it was their turn too. It was important to have a male role-model in nursery. It is important that early years settings promote diversity and positive representation so each child feels valued, proud of who they are when they see themselves. Children also have multiple intelligences so it is important the early years curriculum values the opportunities for children to experience and love the arts and express their creativity.
